# Improving The Energy Efficiency Of Windows In Your Historic Building

One way to enjoy the warm weather is with some home improvement projects!

You do not need to replace the original windows in your historic house or building to make your structure more energy efficient. You can improve the energy efficiency of your historic windows by adding storm windows, weatherizing your original windows and preventing condensation.



## Do Three Simple Weatherizing Tasks

You can stop over 98% of outside air infiltration into your windows by doing these three simple weatherizing tasks:

- 1. **Caulk and paint.** Make sure the exterior casing trim around your windows is caulked and painted well. The exterior casing trim is an area of massive air infiltration. Testing by the <u>Window Preservation Standards Collaborative</u> in 2011 demonstrated that when the casings on the exterior of the window are caulked and painted well, air infiltration around the window opening and from the sash weight pocket is greatly reduced.
- 2. **Add a storm window**. Reduce heat loss from your historic windows by adding a well-fitted, exterior storm window to each of your windows. A storm will also stop air infiltration and protect your primary window sashes from the weather.
- 3. **Repair the glazing compound**. Repair glazing compound that has failed or is missing. Glazing compound seals the glass to the window sash. If it is loose or missing, air can infiltrate your window and reduce its energy efficiency.

#### **Prevent Window Condensation**

If you see condensation on your windows, it is a sign that warm interior air is entering the cavity between your window sashes and storm windows. When the warm air hits the cold storm window, it causes condensation. The effect is the same in the summer when the cooled interior air hits the warm storm window. Condensation can damage your window sills and sashes. To prevent condensation and the resulting damage to your windows, make sure you replace cracked or broken glass and apply weatherstripping at the perimeter of your windows.

# **Preservation Spotlight**

#### A Colorful Tribute To A Stained Glass Artisan

The La Crosse region recently lost a significant member of the local preservation movement.

Philip Varnum, an Onalaska-based glass artisan, passed away peacefully on February 3, 2022, at age 72. Phil was born in La Crosse April 29, 1949. He attended West Salem High School and in 1968 enlisted in the US Army, serving two tours in Chu Lai, Vietnam.

Philip was a Crew Chief on Gunships in the 176<sup>th</sup> A.H.C. "Muskets" and awarded two purple hearts after being shot down. After his discharge in 1970, he worked for the BNSF railroad for 40 years retiring in 2010. He also worked for Toyota of La Crosse part-time for five years.



In retirement, Phil initially learned art glass creation more as a hobby. However, his natural skill with traditional, leaded-channel techniques earned him a lot of restoration work over the years.

Known to some as "Dr. Phil" for his ability to bring any piece back to health, he developed a reputation and generated clients largely through word-of-mouth.

Dr. Phil worked on many historic properties in La Crosse and throughout the region, including significant art glass restoration work for Le Chateau on Cass Street, the Ranum-Nelson House on Rose Street, as well as 314 19th Street S.

Dr. Phil was a family man, a war hero, a tremendously talented glass artisan, as well as a generous and kind human being.

Dr. Phil loved preserving these pieces of La Crosse's history and working in a medium that is hundreds of years old. He was an asset to the preservation movement and will be missed by those who knew him.
